

**Looking Through Anne Frank's Window by Jeff Gottesfeld** (2016) Ages 5-8


A picture book told from the perspective of the tree outside Anne Frank's window—this book introduces her story to a young audience.


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


### Irena's Jar of Secrets by Marcia Vaughn (2011) - Ages 7-11.

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

An amazing and inspirational World War II story about how one man, Raoul Wallenberg saved the lives of many.




# Rescuing the Children: Story of the Kindertransport by Deborah Hodge (2012)


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

Set in Paris during World War II, an unnamed young girl narrates the story of her Jewish family's escape when the Nazis arrive in France



Ages 10-15


Gustave lives in Paris but must leave with his family once their lives are threatened. Gustave must help think of a plan for his family to safely escape to America.




### Tutti's Promise (2018) Ages 10 - 14


