

# UKRAINIAN HOLODOMOR GENOCIDE IN UKRAINE: Lessons for Today's Classroom

The term Holodomor (death by hunger, in Ukrainian) refers to the starvation of millions of Ukrainians in 1932–33 as a result of Soviet policies under Stalin. He attempted to destroy the “breadbasket of Europe” by executing the leadership, dismembering the Ukrainian Orthodox Church and collectivizing the farms. These policies resulted in a massive loss of life due to murder and starvation. This presentation will detail the use of food as a political weapon and the blind eye that the West turned to the crisis. Oksana Kulynych, the daughter of Ukrainian refugees, is a retired NYC educator and former Director of the School of Ukrainian Studies. She will connect the events of Holodomor to the current war in Ukraine.
